The period of Picasso's heavy engagement as a poet and writer runs from 1935 to 1959 -- a great body of notebook poems, largely in continuous, unpunctuated prose, and two plays, *Le désir attrapé par la queue* and *Les quatre petites filles*. Contained in *Picasso: Ecrits*, published by Gallimard in 1989, they will appear in an English version edited and translated by Jerome Rothenberg and Pierre Joris and published by Exact Change. Michel Leiris's appraisal in introduction ("Among the modern writers to whom we can if we must compare him ... I see only James Joyce ... in his *Finnegans Wake*") now seems more accurate in retrospect than Gertrude Stein's earlier dismissal.

Q: If pictures and text are so easy (to convert & ingest), how can we approach MBOX more like TXT?

A: MailBag

- Project from SUNY Albany
 - Preserve email in multiple formats - MBOX, PDF, WARC
 - Take advantage of different features of email format
- Helped us do what we wanted to do. Use case:
 - MBOX preservation copy, PDF access copy
 - No attachments/live websites
 - Key feature: one PDF per message

The guinea pig: Poet Jackson Mac Low

- 3 zip disks from the '90s
- Mbox files exported from Eudora and Juno
- Over 8,000 emails



Where did we start?

- Each MBOX file was one folder of email - could be a few messages or hundreds
- Files were from the late 90s, MBOX format was standardized in 2005
- Nonstandard formatting led to errors, needed to edit MBOX headers, metadata, line lengths before using Mailbag

- Filenames/forced sort of PDFs replicated original email folder
- [Split largest PDFs](#) (thousands of pages) into smaller files for ease of use
- Ingested MBOX files and PDFs into DAMS

Series 22) AUDIOVISUAL MATERIALS: An extensive collection of sound recordings of Mac Low's performances, on reel to reel and audiocassettes, plus a small number of films and video. The materials are arranged according to Jackson Mac Low's personal filing system, which assigned unique numbers to each item.

And if you don't have a DAMS or IR...

- You can still convert, save and store your email files wherever or however you store other digital assets.
- As long as you have PDF copies, you can find a way to serve them.

- Lower-priority emails can be saved as txt or PDF and saved to secure staging servers, and referenced in a finding aid like any other digital file.
- Depending on content, files can be zipped and emailed to patrons on request, or available in the reading room only.
